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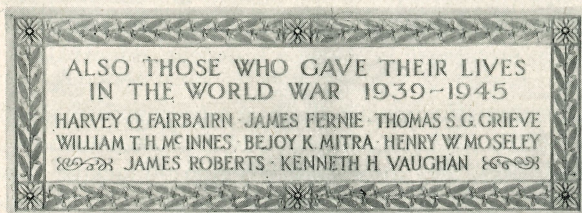
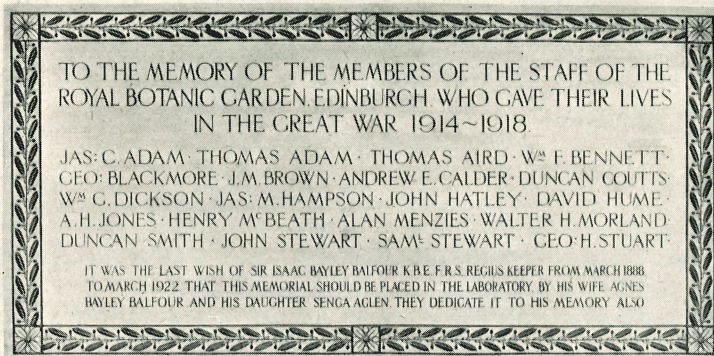
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ROYAL BOTANIC GARDEN WAR MEMORIAL



A plaque commemorating the eight members of the Botanic Garden staff who were killed in the World War, 1939-1945, has now been added to the War Memorial in the entrance hall of the Laboratories. It was unveiled by the Regius Keeper on 11th November 1953.

Those commemorated on it are :—

Sgt. H. O. FAIRBAIRN, R.A.F.	Killed in action in N. Africa.
A/C J. McM. FERNIE, R.A.F.	Died of malaria, India, August 1942.
Sgt. Pilot T. S. G. GRIEVE, R.A.F.	Killed in action, N.W. Europe, August 1942.
L/Sgt. W. T. MCINNES, Argyll & Sutherland Highlanders.	Killed at El Alamein, October 1942.
Sgt. (Pathfinder) B. K. MITRA, R.A.F.	Killed in action, N.W. Europe, January 1944.
Pte. H. W. MOSELEY, Scots Guards.	Died of wounds in Italy, October 1944.
Sgt. J. ROBERTS, Royal Engineers.	Drowned off Tunisia, January 1943.
A/C2 K. F. H. A. VAUGHAN, R.A.F.	Reported missing, Mediterranean, March 1941 ; presumed killed.
