Mediterranean Itineraries

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Since 1938 I have been able to collect copious herbarium material in several Mediterranean countries. The first set of these specimens is now deposited in the Herbarium of the Royal Botanic Gardens, Kew, the second in the Herbarium of the Royal Botanic Garden, Edinburgh.* This therefore seems a suitable time to publish brief itineraries which, it is hoped, may save botanists time and trouble if they wish to find out where and when certain collections were made. It should also serve as a check on duplicate herbarium labels; these may sometimes be hard to decipher, or bear faulty spellings of place names. No attempt has been made in this summary to include all the places visited, but it does contain all those localities where a considerable number of plants were collected.

The countries are arranged alphabetically, and my herbarium numbers are cited for each country in each year. The numbering is sometimes erratic, owing to the filling in of numerical gaps at a later date. My six Turkish journeys are not included and will be published separately.

^{*} The bulk of this material has not yet been critically determined. In the National Herbaria much of it has been laid in at the end of genera until taxonomists find time to tackle it. As I am now concentrating on the flora of Turkey, I shall probably deal with this material only where it affects the taxonomy of the Turkish flora.

Several places in the Paphos area were visited: Ktima, Evretou, Sarama (May 7), Stathos, Pendalia—Amargeti (May 12), Arminou (April 13-14). Accompanied by Mrs. Kennedy, I stayed at the monastery of Chrysorogiatissa from April 8-11, and collected in the Roudhkias valley between Pano Panagia and Kykko. Platres—Aphamis—Perapedhi—Trimiklini (May 16)—Mesopotamos. Trypilos between Kykko and Stavros-tis-Pochas (May 17), Trikoukia nr. Prodhromos, and Pedhoulas. Platres (May 18-19, 21), climbing Chionistra on May 20. Travelling by car, the following places were visited with Mrs. Kennedy: Kolossi castle and Limassol (May 21); Limassol salt lake and C. Gata

(May 22), Lefkara, St. Hilarion, Yaila nr. Halefka (May 23-24).

1043: Saccara was visited in June. From Dec. 7-10 I collected near

Aswan, and from Dec. 13-14 near Luxor and Thebes (up to 6101B).

1944: Stationed in Cairo, short excursions were made into the Eastern Desert. Wadi Digla nr. Helwan (Jan. 15, Oct. 24). Wadi Hôf nr. Helwan (Febr. 6). Wadi Doweiqa on Gebel Mokattam (Febr. 12) and nearby Gebel Giushi (Febr. 16). Wadi Rished nr. Helwan (Febr. 20). Cairo—Suez road (Febr. 20; A march 25); Masara—Helwan (Febr. 26). Gebel Ataqa from Suez, by way of Wadi il Obar (March 6–7). Mariut: Burg el Arab and Abu Sir (March 9–14); part of this collection was lost when two presses were stolen from the train.

A journey was then made, by camel, in the company of Dr. N. Feinbrun and Mr. J. R. Shabetai, through the Gebel Galala plateaux. In N. Galala our route was as follows: Suez—Bir Odeib (March 26)—Wadi Noöz—Ras Noöz (March 29–30)—across the top of Wadi Khafuri—down Wadi Askhar (April 1)—across Wadi Araba to the monastery of St. Antony (April 2). From St. Antony we made two journeys in S. Galala: Wadi Rigba (April 4–6); Um Zenetir plateau (April 7). A very dry spring made this expedition less fruitful than it might otherwise have been; part of the collection is still in store in the Hebrew University, Jerusalem.

Short excursions from Cairo continued: Rosetta (Sept. 24). Cape Abukir (Sept. 25). Abu Roash (Oct. 15). El Birka nr. Marg in the Delta (Oct. 10). Gebel Ataqa from Suez. Giza pyramids (Nov. 19). Wadi Natrun, staying at the monastery of Deir Suriana and visiting the lakes of Um Risha and Hamra (Dec. 24-26).

Attica & Cyclades .- Athens, with excursions to Hymettus and the islands of Hydra (March 30), Kythnos (April 6) and Andros (April 11).

Crete.-Excursion to Akrotiri monasteries (April 17) from Khania. Bus to Sphakia, then on foot to Anopolis and Aradhena gorge (April 22). Bus to Elos, then on foot to Paleóchora (April 27) via Vouta. To Retimo and Koxaré by bus, walking through the Koutaliótiko gorge to Preveli (May 5). From Herakleon to Sternes by bus; climbed Mt. Kophino (May 8). By bus to Sitia and Epanochori; climbed Aphendi Kavutsi (May 12-13), camping at Thriphti; descended to Kavutsi and returned to Sitia. Bus to Tzermiado on Lasithi plain; climbed Spathi (May 17) and descended to Yeraki, Based on Retimo, walked from Agiropolis to Kallikratis, From Khania descended the Imbros gorge to Franko-Kastelli. Climbed Ag. Pnevma from Phré (May 29), camping at "Hosses." Visited Murnies gorge from Khania.

Attica.-Excursions from Athens to Hymettus, Pendeli (June 3) and

Sunium.

Cyclades .- Pholégandros (June 5), Sikinos (June 7) and Santorin (June 12). Crete.-Went to Tzermiado on Lasithi plain (July 7-10), and from Khania to Akrotiri monasteries and Theriso gorge (July 22). Taken ill. Gathorne-Hardy climbed Pachnes (July 25) from Theriso, camping at "Katsiveli" and collecting under my numbers.

Phocis.—Climbed Parnassus from Arachova, sleeping in the Alpine hut

In September I returned to Crete with Mr. R. C. Barneby, and we collected at Aphendi Kavursi, Sitia, Toplou, Palecchora and the Akrotiri. On the mainland we visited Delphi and Arachova. On Oct. 2 I climbed the N. flank of Taygetos from Trypi. Barneby published an account of some of the plants collected in E. Crete in New Flora and Sylva, xi (3), 202 (1939). The specimens are under Barneby's numbers in Herb. Barneby & Ripley; duplicates of many of the rater species are deposited in the Kew Herbarium.

Peloponnese.--By train from Athens to Kalávryta; climbed Chelmos (Oct. 16); slept at the Alpine hut and descended by the Styx gorge to Kalávryta. Collected in the gorge between Megaspelion and Diakoftó

(Oct. 19).

Crete.—Climbed Malaxa (Nov. 12) from Khania, and walked to the Omado plain (Nov. 14). Bus from Khania to Elos, and on foot through Vouta (Nov. 19) to Paleéchora. Bus to Sphakia from Retimo. Visited Koxaré and Koutaliótiko gorge from Retimo. Climbed Mt. Ida (Nov. 29) from Vizari. By bus to Ag. Nicola; climbed Mt. Stavros from Kavutsi (Dec. 3). By bus from Sitia to Zyros; on foot to Zakros (Dec. 7) and Toplou. Visited Tzermiado (Dec. 12) and Khania (Jan. 1, 1949).

Ionian Islands.—Zakynthos (Jan. 10-17), collecting at Krionero, Ag. Georgios nr. Volimes, Skopo and Lithakia. Kephallenia (Jan. 19-25), collecting at Argostoli. Assos and Athera.

Returned to Athens (Hymettus, Febr. 10).

Peloponnese.—By bus from Athens to Gytheon (Febr. 14) and Pyrgos. Walked down the Mani peninsula through Gerolimeni to Porto Kalia (Febr. 17) on C. Matapan. Boat from Porto Kalia to Kalamata, with excursions to Kampos and Gaïtses (Febr. 20). By bus to Methone and Pylos (Febr. 22).

Crete.—Bus from Khania to Paleóchora (Febr. 28—March 2). From Herakleon to Almyros, and to Pyros on Messara plain (March 6); walked from Pyros through the Kophino range, by way of Tris Eklisia and Koudhoumas, to Ag. Dheka (March 8). Visited Tymbaki and Messara bay (March 10). By bus to Ag. Nicola, Episcopi and Epanochori; climbed Aphendi Kavutsi (March 14) via Ag. Joannis, descending to Episcopi through Thriphti. By road to Sitia (March 17), thence on foot to Toplou. Bus to

From Choueifat nr. Beirut the following short excursions were made in the Lebanon: Ein Anub, Suq el Kharb and Aley (Jan. 24); Antelias (Febr. 7); Ein Anub (Febr. 16); coast below Choueifat (Febr. 16, March 23); Nahr el Qelb (Febr. 20); Nahr Beirut below Areiya (Febr. 28); Wadi Damur (March 3); Deir Kubil nr. Choueifat (March 7); Jezzin (March 14); Brummana (March 28).

The following journey was made, on foot and on horseback, into the Syrian Desert and the northern part of Mt. Lebanon. By bus to Nebk, thence on foot to Mar Musa E. of Nebk (April 9.) Bus from Nebk to Homs. Qaryatein (April 12.), riding S.E. to Jebel Rat'tush and Jebel Kukli (April 13.—14.) By lorry from Qaryatein to Palmyra, thence by horse northwards to Bir Slem (April 19), returning to Palmyra. Bus to Bludan in Antilebanon (April 20.), and by road to Hermel (April 20.) From Hermel the northern part of Mt. Lebanon was crossed on foot to Jebel Akar, by way

of Houmairi (Hemeira) and Feesen (Fissani?), reaching Baynu on April 26; some specimens were damaged by damp.

Returning to Choueifat, excursions were made in May to Deir el Beida (pass between Beirut and Zahle, May 15), Modairej and Nahr el Kelb (May 30).

Expeditions followed to the Antilebanon and northern Lebanon. Antilebanon: Zebdani and Bludan (June 6); climbed Jebel Shakif, visiting Ein en Sur (Ein "Ansour" on my labels) and Ein Abouzade. I then went by road to Baynu in northern Lebanon, and climbed Qornat Aruba (June 13) by way of Nebi Shouah and Amouah. Sir was visited on June 16-17, thence by bus to Homs and Nebk (June 21). From Nebk (June 21) the Antilebanon was crossed on foot via Sahel, Flita, Wadi Awaj, Talaat Musa (June 22) and Wadi Jemayli to Baalbek (June 24). An account of this last traverse appeared in Journ. Roy. Host. Soc. Lix (1), 7 (1944).

The Lebanon and Syrian collection of 1943 was left in store in Beirut for two years. Some specimens were damaged or lost through beetle attack, the bulbous plants being the worst affected.

Dead Sea, by boat from Kallia to mouth of R. Arnon and springs of Callirrhoë (June 29). July 4-5: by road from Amman to Wadi Zerka; thence on foot to Jerash; returned to Jerusalem via Allenby bridge.

Edom.—April 14-15: by jeep from Akaba to Wadi Ram, through Wadi Ith'm. By jeep from Ram to Petra through Ma'an (April 16-17), camping out in the tombs of Petra. Climbed Mt. Hor from the E. side (April 18). By horse from Petra to Shobek, via Wadi Musa and Bir Dabaghat (April 19-20). By horse from Shobek to the railway station at Aneize (April 21-22).

Moab.—By car from Amman to Talaat um Binat nr. Ma'in. Thence on foot to the hot springs of Zerka Ma'in, Jebel Attarus (April 25), Wadi Heidan, Methluthe (above Mojib), Dhiban, Wadi Themed and Ziza (April 28).

Gilead.—By bus from Amman to Ajlun, thence on foot to Mar Elias (May 2); Jerash (May 3).
